forecast (v) - to predict or estimate in advance	The weatherman <u>forecasted</u> that it will rain today.
forethought (n) - a thought that comes beforehand, a prediction	She had the <u>forethought</u> to bring along an umbrella in <u>case</u> it rained.
forewarn (v) - to warn beforehand	The weather bureau <u>forewarned</u> the residents of the approaching storm.
posterior (n) - the back side	The <u>posterior</u> of the house was plain, but the front was very attractive.
posthumous (adj) - happening after someone's death	The <u>posthumous</u> reading of his will offered many surprises about his wealth.
